

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
DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Sara Bareilles has a way of sprinkling magic into the soundtrack of my life, like the perfect blend of sugar and spice in every chapter. Her silky voice, whipped together with lyrics that tug at your heartstrings, has always been a comfort, cradling my whirling soul. When I heard she was writing a musical, my mom and I booked a flight to NYC and set the timer for a whirlwind day: lunch at an Irish pub, a matinee of Waitress (starring Bareilles herself as Jenna), a bite-sized apple pie at intermission, and a sweet flight home.

When the news made its way through the thespian grapevine that Waitress was on OTP's next season menu, I couldn't resist the urge to be a part of it. After years of having the director's itch and the passion for acting—from classes at MSU, directing Young Playwrights Festival, children's theatre shows across the Midwest, and teaching with OTP's Young Company—it was time for me to turn up the heat on a bigger project. And what better way to bake up my OTP directorial debut than with Waitress? As the year unfolded, it became clear: my best friend's wedding was falling smack dab in the middle of this show's run. And as the maid of honor, I knew one thing—it was time to dive in and direct.

Waitress serves up a feast of themes: identity, community, courage, and the bittersweet ingredients of life. How does your perception of yourself shift as life folds in new challenges? How does society knead its expectations into your identity? Do you have the courage to slice a new path when the old one becomes overdone? And most importantly-who makes you feel loved? My hope is that this musical transports you to your own third place—the cozy diner of life where everyone knows your name, your usual, and your chosen family makes you feel like you truly matter.




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ORIGINAL CREATIVE BIOGRAPHIES



Sara Bareilles can next be seen starring in the upcoming Tina Fey's series, *GIRLS5EVA*. Bareilles first achieved mainstream critical praise in 2007 with her widely successful hit "Love Song," which reached No. 1 in 22 countries around the world from her debut album Little Voice.

Since then, Sara has gone on to receive seven ${\rm Grammy}{}^{\rm I\!B}$ nominations throughout her career, which include Song of the Year

and Best Female Pop Vocal Performance for "Love Song" and one Album of the Year for her highly acclaimed third studio album, The Blessed Unrest. Her book, Sounds Like Me: My Life (So Far) in Song, was released in the fall of 2015 by Simon & Schuster and is a New York Times best seller. Making her Broadway debut Sara composed the music and lyrics for Waitress, for which she received her first Tony® Award nomination for Best Score and a 2017 Grammy® Award nomination for Best Musical Theater Album. She also made her Broadway acting debut in 2017 by stepping into the lead role in Waitress. 2018 was a big year for Sara, she co-hosted the Tony Awards®, was nominated for an Emmy® and Grammy ® for her role in Jesus Christ Superstar Live in Concert and was awarded with the Songwriters Hall of Fame's Hal David Starlight Award. Sara also teamed up with Apple as an executive producer for Little Voice a 10-episode series, for which she created the original music. What's Inside: Songs from Waitress, her most recent solo studio album, is out on Epic Records. On April 5, 2019 Sara released her fifth full-length and first album of original material since 2013, entitled Amidst the Chaos. For this latest body of work, she joined forces in the studio with legendary Academy® Award-winning producer T Bone Burnett. As a result, the album spotlights her voice as a singer and storyteller like never before, while making an enduring statement.

Jessie Nelson wrote the musical *Waitress* with music and lyrics by Sara Bareilles. The show played on Broadway for 4 years and moved to the West End in London. Sara and Jessie went on to create the show *Little Voice* which they Executive Produced with JJ Abrams for Apple TV. Jessie wrote, directed and produced *Corrina Corrina* and *I Am Sam* staring Sean Penn, who received an Academy Award nomination for his performance. Among her



other directing credits are *Curb Your Enthusiasm* and *Love, the Coopers* with Diane Keaton. Her writing credits include *Step Mom* and *The Story of Us*. She produced *Fred Claus* and *Danny Collins*. In London, Jessie directed *Alice By Heart* which she co-wrote with Steven Sater with music by Duncan Sheik at the National Theater Connections Program and again at MCC in NYC. She began her career as an actress at the Public Theater working with the award-winning experimental theater Mabou Mines and at the New York Shakespeare Festival. She wrote the children's book *Labracadabra*. She has been the artistic Director of the Sundance Screen Writers Lab. 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OLD TOWN PLAYHOUSE ORIGINAL CREATIVE BIOGRAPHIES

The late **Adrienne Shelly** was born in Queens, New York, to Elaine Langbaum and Sheldon Levine. After graduating Jericho High School in Jericho, New York, she enrolled at Boston University and majored in film production. She dropped out after her junior year and moved to Manhattan, where she made a name for herself in independent films with her work in The Unbelievable Truth (1989) and Trust (1990). She eventually moved behind the camera, writing and directing I'll Take You There (1999) and Waitress (2007) (her final film). On November 1, 2006, Adrienne Shelly was murdered. She was survived by her husband Andy Ostroy and their daughter Sophie.



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Leiber & Stoller, Mijac Music, Motown and Famous Music. Sony controls many of the best-known songs ever written, including "New York, New York," "All You Need Is Love," "You've Got a Friend," "Ain't No Mountain High Enough," "Over the Rainbow" and "Stand By Me." In addition, Sony represents the copyrights of such legendary artists as The Beatles, Leonard Cohen, Neil Diamond, Bob Dylan, Michael Jackson, Carole King, Joni Mitchell, Queen, The Rolling Stones, Sting, The Supremes, Hank Williams and Stevie Wonder, among others. Its ever-growing list of chart-topping artists and songwriters includes Alicia Keys, Lady Gaga, P!nk, Shakira, and Taylor Swift.

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
